The grade three's will be taught difference between present and past tense and the construction of sentences using them, classroom cleaning (reasons for classroom cleaning, materials used for cleaning and the importance of having clean class) kutumia msamiati wa nyumbani kutunga sentensi, addition of fractional numbers and the story of Jonah (how did Jonah disobey God and what were the results of Jonah disobedience).</p>
